Foot Washing

Foot washing is a symbol of humility and servanthood. In the gospel of John, there is an account of Jesus washing each of His disciple’s feet at the Last Supper. In John 13:14–17, Jesus instructs his disciples: *“If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another’s feet. For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you. Most assuredly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master; nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them.”*

Communion

Communion, also known as The Lord's Supper, is mentioned in the New Testament books of the Bible and refers to the act of thanks and remembrance of the death of Christ and our relationship through the new

covenant. The first communion took place during the Passover Feast as Jesus ate with his disciples. The act of communion uses bread to symbolize the body of Jesus and wine to represent His blood. As we take communion, the purpose is to remember his sacrifice on the cross, examine ourselves and confess our sins, and proclaim Him as Lord and Savior.

Matthew 26:26-29

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, “Take and eat; this is my body.”

Then he took a cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, “Drink from it, all of you. This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you, I will not drink from this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom.”
